The text-shadow property is used to add shadow effect to text. The text-shadow property is used to add color to text. The text-shadow property is used to add a blur effect to the shadow.

Syntax:

text-shadow: h-shadow v-shadow blur-radius color|none|initial|inherit;

Values:

- 1. h-shadow: It is the required value. It specifies the position of the horizontal shadow and allows negative values.
- 2. v-shadow: It is also the required value that specifies the position of the vertical shadow. It does not allow negative values.
- 3. blur-radius: It is the blur-radius, which is an optional value. Its default value is 0.
- 4. color: It is the color of the shadow and also an optional value.
- 5. none: It is the default value, which means no shadow.
- 6. initial: It is used to set the property to its default value.
- 7. inherit: It simply inherits the property from its parent element.
